We have been in Texas since the first full week of January, with a complete tally of our activities including: visiting 24 churches, traveling through 14 States, driving around 9,000 miles, purchasing both a truck and a fifth wheel, and thanking the LORD for at least three new supporting churches.

Two of the men also accompanied Bro. Luis on a roadtrip to Punta Arenas (from Osorno; 33 hours one way) to participate in a Bible conference held by missionary Derek Hansen. The level of involvement and ownership taken by our church folks has been exciting to watch from a distance.

Thank you for your faithful prayers and support for the LORD's ministry in Southern Chile, as we continue to travel around North America, visiting supporting churches and raising more support.
